Priorities for action 2017-2018

The Greater Bendigo Rural Communities Committee (RCC) was developed as an action under the Greater Bendigo Rural Communities Strategy. The Rural Communities Strategy was adopted by Council in August 2016. The RCC includes a representative from Greater Bendigo's twelve community planning committees and related groups and met for the first time on 21 March 2017. The aim of the RCC is to provide advice to Council on important rural issues within the municipality. RCC members have identified the following focus areas as priorities in the 2017-18 financial year:
